The College of Arts and Social Sciences (CASS) faculty and staff, led by Dean Agnes M. Macaraeg, College Dean, spearheaded the blessing of the newly renovated Smith Hall (CASS building) last October 13, 2017. Presiding over the blessing was Rev. Father Ramon Christopher Molina.

Present during the ceremony were key TSU officials Dr. Myrna Q. Mallari, TSU President, and Dr. Armee N. Rosel, Vice President for Academic Affairs.

The Smith Hall, home to the College

of Arts and Social Sciences, was constructed in 1984 and began servicing primarily the flagship courses of the College of Engineering in 1988. Consequently, the building's utilization was shared by CASS, the College of Engineering (COE), the College of Business and Accountancy (CBA). During the latter years however, the CBA and the COE, now the College of Engineering and Technology or CET, moved to their new buildings, and the former College of Art and Sciences, now Arts and Social Sciences, settled at Smith Hall.
