Basic Safety on “Scaffolding, Electrical, Hand Powered Tools & Hot Works “

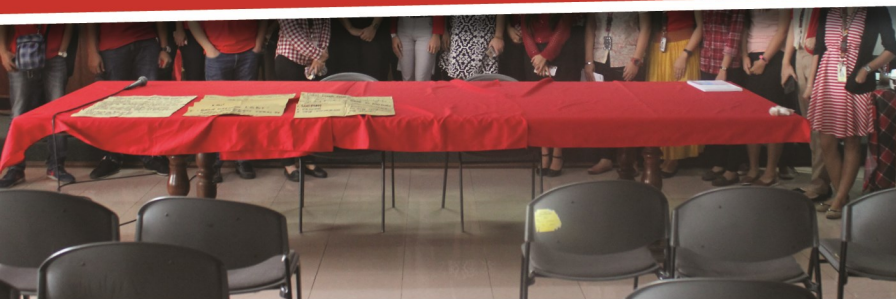

Rombaoa Jr, Safety Officer III, he provided lectures, video presentations and answered the queries of the participants. It was attended by twenty-five (25) participants.



Health, Safety, Environment and Quality Risk Assessment

The Seminar helped the Deans, Directors, Office Heads, Chairpersons and Division Heads identify and be familiarized with hazards and risks. It also helped them conduct hazard and risk assessment. It was held on July 4, 2017 (Batch 1) and July 5, 2017 (Batch 2), 8:00 am -5:00 pm. It was offered by (OHSEC), the resource speaker for batch 1 was Mr. Juvie Dela Cruz and for batch 2 was Mr. Dante L. Calapatia. They both conducted lectures, video presentation, question and answer, hazard and risk assessment, group activities and workshop. On July 4, 2017 (Batch 1), there were fifty (50) attendees and on July 5, 2017 (Batch 2), there were forty-two (42) attendees.





Gender Sensitivity Orientation

The seminar provided awareness on gender sensitivity and key concepts on gender and development as supported by R.A. 8760 (General Appropriations Act) to all Newly Hired Employee and Lecturers from September 2015-Present. It was conducted on July 20, 2017, Thursday, 8:00-12:00 noon for batch 1 and 1:00-5:00 pm for batch 2. It was offered by Center for Gender and Development in cooperation with HRMDU. For Batch 1, the speaker was Ms. Suzanne P. Cruz, Research Assistant II of GAD and for batch 2 was Ms. Ninez B. Tulo, Assistant Professor 3 of OIA. They both conducted lectures, group activities and workshops. For batch 1, it was attended by forty-two (42) participants and for batch 2, by seventeen (17) participants.

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TSU establishes GAD Resource Pool of Experts

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With the increasing number of requests for capacity-building activities within and outside the university, the Center for Gender and Development (CGAD) invited faculty and personnel of the Tarlac State University who are willing to be a part of the GAD Resource Pool.

Twenty faculty members and personnel from various colleges and offices committed on becoming a member of GAD Resource Pool of Experts and attended the first Trainer's Training on August 2, 2017 at the Main AVR.

The training aims to provide the participants an understanding of key concepts in Gender and Development; to enable them to identify gender biases resulting to gender issues; to develop individual awareness and sensitivity in perceiving gender issues in the university and the community; and to develop their

confidence to do their work as gender advocates.

"I've been a director of GAD for more than a decade already. When GAD started, I did not know what to do. I invited speakers from other universities to conduct trainings in TSU. I also attended trainings and studies concepts in GAD. Until such time that I am capable of understanding GAD Concepts. GAD is from womb to tomb, so its scope is wide... As gender advocates, I hope you will be an instrument to attain our vision and goals" CGAD Director, Dr. Rita E. Pulmano explained.

At the end of the seminar, the participants agreed on cascading their knowledge to their respective colleges and offices and committed on conducting at least one GAD activity per semester as part of their advocacy in Gender and Development.



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
