

In compliance to the requirement of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Tarlac State University Medical Services Office conducted a Forum on HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus), TB (Tuberculosis), and Hepatitis A and B for the newly-hired faculty and non-teaching personnel of the University on May 18.

The following were discussed by the medical staff: HIV/ AIDS - Sylyn D. Rico and Rhoda Feliciano; Hepatitis A and B - Julius Erick C. Balilo and Jay Harold Panlilio.

Dr. Rommel M. Hernandez, Director of the Medical Services Office, talked about the causes and symptoms of Tuberculosis and how it can be prevented.
